PART II. ADMINISTRATION; PROFESSIONAL FEES

(a) Consent of [Debtor](#)ⁱ.

The filing of a petition under Title 11 by a debtor engaged in business is deemed to be the debtor's consent to mail redirection by the interim [trustee](#)ⁱ and the trustee.

(b) Objection by Debtor

If the debtor does not consent to mail redirection, the debtor shall file a written objection with the Clerk. Upon the filing of the debtor's objection, the Court shall promptly set a hearing on notice to the debtor, trustee and [United States Trustee](#)ⁱ. After the filing of the objection, and pending order of Court, the redirection shall continue, but the trustee shall hold, and not open, the debtor's mail.
