Notice Regarding Scheduled Hearings before the Honorable Stephen L. Johnson from March through April 2020

On March 10, 2020, the United States Centers for Disease Control issued its *Recommendations for 30-day Mitigation Strategies for Santa Clara County, California*, which provides strategies to slow the spread of respiratory virus infections including the novel coronavirus SARS-C0V-2, the cause of the disease COVID-19.

In order to comply with these Recommendations, unless otherwise ordered in a specific case or proceeding, Judge Johnson hereby orders as follows:

- 1. The court is <u>not</u> altering hearing dates at this time, except as noted below.
- 2. All hearings scheduled on Judge Johnson's calendars will be **conducted telephonically** only. The court cannot accommodate personal appearances at this time.
- 3. Counsel who would like to appear at a hearing must do so by telephone. The instructions for appearing by telephone can be found on the court's website, at http://www.canb.uscourts.gov/procedure/district-oakland-san-jose-san-francisco/policy-and-procedure-appearances-telephone
- 4. Unrepresented parties (people who do not have lawyers):
 - a. If you would like to attend a hearing by telephone, please follow these instructions: http://www.canb.uscourts.gov/procedure/district-oakland-san-jose-san-francisco/policy-and-procedure-appearances-telephone. There is NO COST to you for this service.
 - b. If you cannot appear by telephone but still want to appear at a hearing, contact the courtroom deputy, Anna Lee, at 408-278-7517. If you do not reach her, leave a message. Your matter will be rescheduled to a date after April 5, 2020, when we hope to resume court proceedings in person. You will be notified of the later hearing date.
- 5. If an unrepresented party appears at court in person on a calendared hearing and wants to be heard, but has not given prior notice to the courtroom deputy, the court will reschedule the hearing to a future calendar to accommodate that appearance. If this occurs, it will be announced at the calendar call and noted on the docket.
- 6. Parties may continue matters that are set for hearing to future hearing dates. Dates are posted on Judge Johnson's calendar page. http://www.canb.uscourts.gov/judge/johnson/calendar. Continuances can be requested by uploading an application (for ex parte matters) or stipulation (for contested matters and adversary proceedings) and a proposed order resetting the matter.
- 7. The court will not hold evidentiary hearings during this time, and these may be rescheduled on a case-by-case basis.
