Procedures for Appearing on an AT&T Conference Call for the Honorable Stephen L. Johnson

Using information supplied by the courtroom deputy, dial into the AT&T Conference call **15 minutes prior** to the scheduled hearing.

- If signing in by computer, **the Court's preferred method**, identify yourself when prompted.
- If signing in by telephone only, the courtroom deputy will take roll prior to hearing.

Persons appearing will be authorized by the courtroom deputy to **speak only on the matter they are assigned to**.

Persons requesting **continuances** should notify the courtroom deputy by email in advance of the hearing, otherwise matters will be called in order.

Please ensure your **equipment** is adequate. Also, ensure that you have dedicated, **quiet space** for the call. Do not conduct other conversations while on the call even if you are muted.

To join the call via computer (Court's Preferred Method):

1. Select "**As Guest**"
2. Enter **(888) 363-4735** in the Dial-in phone number
3. Meeting access code: **4426317**
4. Enter your **first and last name and case name**
5. Check the box "**I'm not a robot**" and follow the prompt
6. Click on the "**Call me**" button. You will be prompted to add your dial-out number. **AT&T will dial out to the number you provided.**
7. When prompted, **select #1** to join the conference
